OBITUARY
MR F. W. MUNT

We regret to report the death of Mr. Frederick Waldo MUNT, for many years a Borough auditor, which took place yesterday (Friday) morning, at the advanced age of 87. Deceased was out and about during the previous week but had a stroke on the Sunday previous. For the last 25 years Mr. MUNT had conducted an antique and general agency business at 31, Station Street. Of late years he had been assisted in the management of it by his daughter, Mrs. E. POPE. At one time Mr. MUNT owned a flourishing draper's business at 13, High Street, which he had inherited from his father. In his younger days he was a keen pigeon fancier and carried off a number of prizes at local shows. A very zealous collector for the Ryde Royal Regatta, Mr. MUNT once boarded the German Emperor's yacht to secure a subscription. He had been the local agent for the Liverpool, London and Globe Insurance Co. for nearly half a century. Fifty years ago Mr. MUNT was a sidesman at St. James' Church, and for a number of years previously had been a member of the choir. He was also a member of the Buffaloes. Although of late years afflicted with deafness, Mr. MUNT had always a keen interest in the advancement of the town. His passing will be regretted amongst a wide circle of friends. His only son, Mr. F. H. MUNT is in the Royal Navy serving as Chief Electrical Artificer. His ship is at present in Chinese waters. Mr. MUNT's wife died eight years ago.

The Vicar of Ryde (the Rev. W. N. MARTIN) officiated at the funeral of the late Mr. F. W. MUNT which took place at All Saints' Church on Monday afternoon. The interment followed at the cemetery. The mourners: were Mr. and Mrs E. POPE (son-in-law and daughter), Mrs. F. H. MUNT (daughter-in-law), Miss D. POPE and Miss C. POPE (grand-daughters), Mr. F. R. POPE and Mr. R. J. POPE (grandsons), and Mr. R. NETTEN (Cowes). Mr. F. H. MUNT (son) was unable to be present as he is in the Royal Navy serving in Chinese waters.
