DEATH OF MAJOR EDWARD CROFT MURRAY

The death occurred on Monday at Perivale, Play-Lane, of Major **Edward CROFT MURRAY**, late the Norfolk Regiment. He was 86 years of age and had a seizure 10 days prior to his demise. Major MURRAY was the eldest son of Capt. Edward MURRAY, of Brighton, and was born in 1847 and married in 1879 Julia Elizabeth, the youngest daughter of Major George WILLCOCK, K.I.S., Madras. He came to Ryde to live about 40 years ago and had Perivale built in 1895. His wife, who was a great rosarian and was at one time a member of the County Education Committee, predeceased him in January, 1929. He was a well-known figure in Ryde and was keenly interested in the District Nursing Association and the County Hospital. He was a member of the Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club and was one of the oldest members of the Bembridge Sailing Club, having been elected in 1890. At one time he owned a 5-ton yawl.

The funeral took place at noon on Thursday and was of a simple character. The first part of the service was conducted by the Rev. V. J. FLETCHER at the Parish Church, and the interment was at the Cemetery. The coffin was covered with the Union Jack, on which rested the burgee of the Bembridge Sailing Club.

The chief mourners were Mrs. CROFT MURRAY (sister-in-law), Mr. E.F. CROFT MURRAY, and Major G. WILLCOCK (nephews), Major and Mrs. Owen CROFT of Hereford (cousins), Miss COCHRANE, Miss CHESSLE, Miss KEMP, and Messrs. V. and F. KEMP

(gardeners). Among others present were Ald. A. ANDREWS, J.P. (chairman), and Mr. F. DU BUISSON, Lieut.-Col. P. MURRAY, Dr. J.D. DAVIES, Dr. A.B. WADE, the Rev. A. WARDROPER, Mrs. DAUBUZ, Major Claude DAUBUZ, Mr. Wyndham RICKETTS, the Misses CAREY, Mr. J.B. COOMBES, Mrs. S. JAMES, Mrs. QUINTON, Mrs. SPURGEON, Miss THIRKELL (representing Mr. W.H.P.F. THIRKELL), Miss BRUCE, Mrs. NICHOLLS, Nurse BOLTON, Mr. F. KEMP, and Mr. C.W.H. SPRINGER.
