DEATH OF MR A. J. NORRIS

The death took place on Sunday at 2 Edward-street, of Mr. **Arthur John NORRIS**, for many years well known in business life of the town. Mr. NORRIS, who was 67 years of age, was in the employ of Mr. James STAMP, butcher, for 20 years, and in 1905 he commenced in business on his own account at 87 High-street. Eight years ago failing health caused his retirement. He was a very old member of the Foresters and the R.O.A.B., and much respected in business and social circles.
