

**MARRIAGE OF MR. H. G. NUTT  
AND MISS FLORENCE MARY SCHOFIELD**

The marriage of Mr. H. Gascoigne NUTT, (youngest son of the Rev. Robert NUTT, and Miss Florence Mary SCHOFIELD (only child of Vincent C. SCHOFIELD, Esq. of Haylands Manor) owing to sad bereavement in the bridegroom's family, took place very quietly at St. Michael's Church, Swanmore, on Tuesday last, at 9.30 a.m. The first part of the service was taken by the bride's uncle, the Rev. E. H. ASHTON, Vicar of Codford St. Mary's, Wilts, and the second by the Rev F. J. HANBURY, Vicar of St. Michael's. The alter was beautifully decorated with white flowers by Miss WILSON, who also kindly presided at the organ. The bride was given away by her father, and wore a simple dress of silk, with white chiffon sash and waistcoat, and white straw hat trimmed with wings and chiffon. Mr. Charles NUTT was best man. The bride and bridegroom left by the 11.15 boat for London, en route to Scotland, where the honeymoon will be spent. The bride's going away dress was a black cloth coat and skirt, white silk bodice, trimmed bebe ribbon; black hat and feathers.
