**Death of Mr. W. PADGET.-** The death took place suddenly on Sunday at his home, Braemar, Upper Arnold-road, of Mr. Walter PADGET, aged 71. Mr. PADGET had been in his garden, but returned to the house complaining of feeling unwell and in a short while collapsed and passed away. Deep sympathy is felt for his sister who has been residing with him since the death of his wife about two years ago. Mr. PADGET was a retired engineer and came from Wakefield, Yorks, about eight years ago. He was a prominent bowler, a vice-president of the I.W. Bowling Association, and a popular member of the Ryde B.C. He was also a vice-president of the Ryde Town Club.

The funeral service was conducted on Wednesday at the Cemetery by the Rev. C. HEALD. The mourners were the Rev. H. PADGET (brother), Miss PADGET (sister), Mr. and Mrs. PADGET (nephew and niece), Miss ALLEN (sister-in-law), Miss ALLEN, Miss D. MARVIN, and Miss DURNFORD. Among those present were Messrs. E. C.
