### OCTOGENARIAN'S SUDDEN DEATH

Mr. **Frederick PEACH**, an 82-year-old China veteran, and a retired stonemason, was found lying dead on Sunday evening on the doorstep of his house, 74 Swanmore-road. For many years he had lived alone. The discovery was made by Mrs. DYER, a neighbour, at about 8.30 p.m. It appears that the deceased had visited his daughter, Mrs. BATTERSBY, of Upper High-street, that afternoon, and, after leaving her just after 7 o'clock, was the victim of a heart attack. Dr. PRIDMORE was sent for, but Mr. PEACH was already dead.

It was deemed unnecessary to hold an inquest.
