**DEATH OF MRS. PEEL.-** It is with regret we have to record the death of Mrs. Emily Sophie PEEL, of St. George's Lodge, widow of Col. Arthur PEEL, 7th Lancers, and eldest daughter of the late Gen. Sir Samuel BROWNE, V.C., K.C.S.I., G.C.B., and Lady BROWNE, formerly of the Wood. The deceased was on a visit to Bath and died suddenly on October 31st. The remains were brought to Ryde and the funeral took place on Wednesday week at all Saints' Church, the Vicar (the Rev. W. N. MARTIN) officiating. There was a full choral service and the hymns "O Heavenly Jerusalem" and "Fight the good fight" were sung. The interment was at the Cemetery in the same grave as that of the late Col. PEEL, who died in 1922. The mourners were Gen. S. D. BROWNE (brother), Mrs. CRADOCK and Miss Violet BROWNE (sisters), Mrs. Percy BROWNE (sister-in-law), Col. Basil PEEL and Mr. Douglas PEEL. There were many beautiful floral tributes.
