**DEATH OF MR. W.V. READ.** - A much respected resident, **Mr. William Vatter READ**, passed away on Friday week at The Lodge, Wellwood, Quarr-hill, in his 79<sup>th</sup> year. He was a native of Arreton and in early days served in the Royal Horse Artillery. When invalided from the Army he entered the employment of the late Col. Hamilton TATTNALL, of Wellwood, as coach-man, and gave 50 years' of devoted service to the family, latterly with the Misses TATTNALL. He was one of the founder members of the Institute. He was a captain of the Boys' Brigade company and a bronze medallist of St. John's Ambulance Corps, for which he acted as an instructor in the village. He was a regular worshipper, when health permitted, at the Methodist Church. The sincerest sympathy is felt with his widow and family.

The funeral service was conducted at the Methodist Church on Monday by the Revs. A. TRIGGS and F. SMITH. The hymns "I heard the voice of Jesus say" and "The day Thou gavest," were sung. Mrs. R.
