The Late Major G. ROWLAND.—We regret to record the death of Major George ROWLAND, of Eastfield, Ryde, late of the 1st Royal Regiment, which took place somewhat suddenly on the 18th inst., after a very short illness. The deceased gentleman, who was well known in Ryde, was the eldest surviving son of the late Colonel George Tempest ROWLAND, R. A.

The funeral was on Monday last, the first part of the service being held at Holy Trinity Church, Ryde, by the Rev. J. E. EDDIS, who also officiated at the Cemetery, where the interment took place in a brick grave. The remains were enclosed in a metal shell with outer casket of panelled and wax polished oak, with handsome brass handles, on the raised lid being a brass plate bearing the engraved inscription:

GEORGE ROWLAND,

Born 2nd July, 1826, Died 18th June, 1913.

The principal mourners were Colonel ROWLAND (brother) and Mrs. ROWLAND (sister-in-law). Amongst others at the Church were Dr. J. D. DAVIES (deceased's medical attendant), Colonel BECKER, Commander Douglas FORSYTH, R.N., General ROOKE, and many others. A number of beautiful wreaths were sent by relatives and friends.
