DEATH OF A RETIRED SCHOOLMASTER

The death took place at Englefield. Argyll-street, on Saturday, of Mr. **Harry SAIT**, a former schoolmaster at Wootton. Mr. SAIT, who was 74 years of age, had been in indifferent health for some time, but the end came somewhat unexpectedly. A native of Alresford, Hants, he was trained for the scholastic profession at Winchester, and after holding appointments in several parts of the country, came to the Island 30 years ago as head-master of the Wootton school. From this position he retired in 1919 after a long and successful tenure. During his residence in the village he contributed much to its general welfare, and for some years was the organist at St. Mark's Church. He made many friends, and nothing gave him greater pleasure than to hear of the success of any of his old pupils and to know that he retained the respect of his former scholars in after life. Mr. SAIT was a member of the Conservative Club and an ardent enthusiast for the cause. Sincere sympathy is felt for the widow and family by his many friends in the town and at Wootton.

The funeral took place on Wednesday, the first part of the service being held at the Parish Church, conducted by the Rev. H. COLLIER, a personal friend. The chief mourners were Mrs. SAIT (widow), Misses May, Edith, and Kathleen SAIT (daughters), Messrs. Harry, Roderick, Hugh, and Cuthbert SAIT (sons), Mr. and Mrs. TOBITT of Yaverland (cousins), and Mesdames Harry, R., and C. SAIT (daughters-in-law). Among others present at the church were Mr. W. DORE, Mrs. and Miss JEATT, Mrs. AUSTIN, Mrs. WHITFIELD, Miss JACKSON, and Mr. A. W. NICHOLLS.

The interment was at the Cemetery, and in accordance with the deceased's wishes there were no flowers.
