**CHIEF BOOKING CLERK'S DEATH.**- After a painful illness of about 10 weeks' duration the death of Mr. Walter John SATCHELL, of St. John's Wood-road, took place on Sunday. Deceased was chief booking clerk at the Esplanade and Pier-head stations, having been employed at the former station between 13 and 14 years. He was a Ryde man, but had previously been employed at Portsmouth. Mr. SATCHELL, who was 41, was of a very amiable disposition, and extremely popular amongst those with whom he was brought into contact. He leaves a widow and one child.

The funeral took place on Wednesday. The mourners were Mrs. W. J. SATCHELL (widow), Mrs. SATCHELL (mother), Mrs. PLUMMER (sister-in-law), and Mr. and Mrs. SPRAGG. Amongst others present were Messrs.
