He had been a cripple since infancy. He was employed as a hairdresser's assistant by Mrs. DAVIES, of High-street, Ryde. He was a member of the Methodist Church and was a bright and popular lad.

The Rev. A. TRIGGS conducted the funeral at the Methodist Church on Monday. The hymns sung were "Rock of ages" and "Abide with me." Mrs. A. TRAVES was the organist. The mourners were Mrs. SATCHELL (mother), Mr. W. WICKETT (uncle), Miss SATCHELL (sister), Messrs. R. and J. WICKETT (uncles), Mesdames PRINCE, PARKES, and R. WICKETT (aunts), Mr. C. WICKETT (cousin), and the Misses PENDERGAST and N. TAYLOR.
