## MRS. M. S. SHEARME

Mrs. Mary Stewart SHEARME, the widow of Canon John SHEARME, a vicar of Ryde from 1892 until 1905, died on Tuesday at "The Elms," Great Preston Road, Ryde, at the advanced age of 90.

Exceedingly well-known and loved in Ryde, where she had resided for many years, Mrs. SHEARME was exceptionally active and was still able to a large extent to pursue her literary interests. She was the daughter of the late Mr. Henry Fowler BROADWOOD, of Surrey, and a descendent of John BROADWOOD, the originator of the BROADWOOD piano, and herself possessed considerable musical talent.

During the period of her husband's ministry in Ryde, Mrs. SHEARME did most useful and lasting work in the parish, having a particularly keen interest in the All Saint's Mother's Union and Girl's Friendly Society. With Canon SHEARME, she formerly resided at Upwood, Ryde, and in recent years had been a worshipper at St. John's Church, where she had been enrolling member of the Mother's Union. Her passing on Tuesday followed a sudden illness on the previous day.

The funeral on Thursday was at St. John's Church. The Rev. E. T. H. ROYDS officiated and the hymns "As now the sun's," and "O strength and stay" were sung, the choir chanting Psalm121 and the Nunc Dimmittis. Mr. R. H. TOOGOOD was at the organ.
