A SAD BEREAVEMENT.- The deepest sympathy is felt with Mr. and Mrs. J. F. SHEPPARD, of the Wolseley Inn, Monkton-street, in the death of their daughter, Dorothy Grace, from pneumonia, after a fortnight's illness, on Thursday week. Miss SHEPPARD was just 19 years of age. She was a Sunday-school teacher at Holy Trinity Church and a popular member of the Girl's Social Club.

The funeral service took place on Tuesday at the church, when both these organisations were represented. The Rev. Noel H. STUBBS officiated. Mr. A. P. JAMES was at the organ and "Jesu, Lover of my soul" was sung. The mourners were the bereaved parents, Messrs. W. and E. SHEPPARD (brothers), Mrs. VICKERY, Mrs. J. WHEELER, and Miss S. WHEELER (aunts), Miss N. BEAN and Miss M. SELF. The interment was at the Cemetery. Over 30 beautiful wreaths were placed on the grave, including tokens from the Holy Trinity Sunday-school and Social Club, and the bouquet carried by Mrs. LOCKE (a fellow Sunday-school teacher), who was married at Trinity Church on Monday. Messrs.

WHEELER Bros. were the undertakers.
