DEATH OF MR. J. F. SHEPPARD.---The death occurred at the County Hospital on Friday week, following an operation, of Mr. John Frederick SHEPPARD, licensee of the Wolseley Hotel, Monkton-street, for 22 years. The deceased, who was 69 years of age, had been ill for only a week. He was formerly a member of St. Michael's choir and afterwards of St. Thomas's choir, and also a member of the Trinity Club and formerly of the Liberal Club.

The remains were taken to Holy Trinity Church on Monday evening, and the Vicar (the Rev. Noel H. STUBBS) conducted the funeral on Tuesday. The mourners were the widow, Messrs. W. and E. SHEPPARD (sons), Miss K. SHEPPARD and Mrs. BUSHELL (daughters), Mr. C. SHEPPARD (brother), Messrs. J. COOPER. G and J. WHEELER and R. HOLT (brothers in law), Miss BEAN, Miss TAYLOR, Mrs. J. WHEELER, Mrs. PERKIS, Mrs. YERBERRY, and Mr. C. DENTON. Those present in the church included the Mayor (Ald. C. J. de LAUNAY), the town clerk (Mr. T. J. FAWDRAY), and Mr. JANAWAY. There were 80 wreaths, including one from St. Thomas's choir.
