BINSTEAD PILOT KILLED

"Accident During Air Operations".

Sergeant -Pilot **Edmund Eric SHEPPARD**, of 3, Chapel-Road, Binstead, has been reported killed on active service. The official news of his death received by his mother, Mrs. A.K. SHEPPARD, stated that he was killed on October 18th in a flying accident at Wormwall while engaged in an air operation.

SHEPPARD, who was 23, had been in the R.A.F. since leaving Ryde Upper Grade School at the age of 16. He had served abroad and was a member of a famous squadron composed of planes given by the Nizam of Hydrerabad, which is said to have brought down over 60 enemy machines.

He has shot down several Nazi planes, some over the Isle of Wight.

He was well-known in Binstead and Ryde, where he had a wide circle of friends. The body was brought to the Island on Tuesday . The funeral took place at Binstead Church yesterday (Wednesday) afternoon and will be more fully reported in our next issue.

SERGEANT PILOT E.E. SHEPPARD'S FUNERAL

Binstead Villager's Tribute

The villagers of Binstead paid their last tribute to the memory of Sergeant Pilot **Edmund Eric SHEPPARD**, only son of Mrs. SHEPPARD, of 3 Chapel-Road, at the funeral at the Church of the Holy Cross on Wednesday of last week.

The popularity and respect in which Sergeant Pilot Edmund Eric SHEPPARD was held by all who knew him was shown both by the large congregation present and the many beautiful wreaths that were placed on the grave. He was killed the previous week in a flying accident after a successful career in the R.A.F. during which time he had shot down four Nazi planes and severely damaged others.

An R.A.F. guard of honour was present and the members of his unit acted as pall-bearers. The Rev. C. RIDLEY RICHARDSON, an R.A.F. chaplain, assisted the Rev. C. HEALD, Rector of Binstead at the funeral service and read the committal over the grave. A trumpeter sounded the R.A.F. "Last Post" and "Reveille."
