## BUSINESS MAN'S DEATH Mr. C. W. H. SPRINGER

We regret to place on record the death, which occurred at the Royal I.W. County Hospital on Thursday, of **Mr. Charles William Henry SPRINGER**, of 36 Swanmore Road, Ryde.

Succumbing to a long period of failing health, Mr. SPRINGER, who was 62 years of age, was a well-known and highly respected resident of the Swanmore district. For many years he was in the employ of the late Ald. G. A. BLACKALL as grocer's assistant, and on the alderman's retirement from the business of 20 years ago Mr. SPRINGER became the proprietor.

He took an active interest in the British Legion, of which he was vice-president and member of the committee, and until his health began to fail he was also a member of the Legion Club.

A valued worker in connection with St. Michael's Church, he had been a member of the choir since boyhood. Sympathy is felt with his widow.

Fellow tradesmen in the town and many members of the British Legion were among the large congregation at the funeral service at St. Michael's Church on Monday. The Rev. H. Anderton RAYMOND officiated, and the choir led the chanting of the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm and the singing of "Abide with Me."
