OBITUARY MR. W. G. SQUIBB

Many people in the town will regret the passing of Mr. William George SQUIBB, manager (for Messrs. MEW LANGTONS) of the Eagle Hotel, High Street, which took place on Friday morning. Deceased was a native of Ryde, and for 21 years before the late war he worked in the wine department of Messrs. COLENUTTS, in Union Street. During the war he witnessed a good deal of heavy fighting whilst serving with the R.F.A. on the Western Front, and in 1917 was badly gassed. It was the effects of this which accelerated Mr. SQUIBB's death, as he was only aged 47. After being in a convalescent camp for 18 months he was discharged and took up an appointment at Messrs. MEW LANGTON's Brewery, and was later offered the managership of the Eagle, which he accepted. Mr. SQUIBB was a member of the British Legion, the Manchester Unity of Oddfellows, and the Clarence Lodge, R.A.O.B. His other activities included a prominent part in the Ryde Licensed Victuallers' whist league, and a member of the old Liberal Club.

The Vicar of Ryde (the Rev. W. N. MARTIN) conducted the funeral service at the Parish Church on Tuesday afternoon. The mourners were as follows: Mrs. W. SQUIBB (widow), Mr. W. SQUIBB (father), Mr. and Mrs. E. A. DYER (son and daughter-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. A. SQUIBB (brother and sister-in-law), Mr. H. SQUIBB (brother) Mrs. A. RANSOM (sister), Mr. C.
