### **MR. J. P. SUTTON**

The funeral took place on Monday, at Elmfield Congregational Church, followed by interment at Ryde Cemetery, of Mr. James Peter SUTTON, aged 85, a well-known Elmfield resident, of 1 Southsea Cottages, Somerset Road, who died the previous Wednesday.

A native of Shirley, Southampton, Mr. SUTTON came to the Island as a boy and was apprenticed to Messrs. SIBLEY, of Star Street, Ryde. He was later employed as a mason by Messrs. LANGDON, with whom he remained for 52 years until his retirement due to failing health, nine years ago. He was almost a life-long member of the Hampshire Friendly Society.

Five years ago Mr. and Mrs. SUTTON, who lost their only son in the first world war, celebrated their golden wedding. In addition to a widow he leaves a daughter.

The Rev. P. D. ANNETTS officiated at the funeral service, at which the organist (Mrs. D. MURKELL) accompanied the hymn "How sweet the name of Jesus sounds."

KIRBY, N. SMITH, A. SMITH and Miss K. SUTTON (nieces), Cllr. W. SUTTON and Mr. F. RAYNER (nephews).
