MRS. TAPLIN

We regret to record the death on Tuesday of Mrs. **TAPLIN**, the well-known greengrocer and fruiterer of Union-street. Mrs. TAPLIN has been connected with business in the town for many years. Her first husband (Mr. BEVIS) originally started in Castle-street, and after his death his energetic widow continued to carry on the business successfully. Shortly after marrying Mr. TAPLIN, the business was removed to Union-street. Mrs. TAPLIN has been suffering for a long time from an incurable complaint, and her death was not unexpected.

Spelling of the surname varied in all records, so difficult to decide which was correct
