Death of Mr. J. E. M. TAYLOR.---The death took place at 14 Pellhurst Road on Thursday of Mr. John March TAYLOR, aged 50, eldest son of Mr. H. V. TAYLOR, T.C., who was mayor in 1949-50. He served in the East Berkshire Regiment in the first world war and was badly wounded in France. For the last 30 years he had been in partnership with his sister, Miss Alva TAYLOR, in a dairy business, but for some 10 years impaired health had prevented him taking an active part in the business. Before the last war he was a keen member of the Buccaneers and the Ryde Sports Club, and he was a member of the Social Club and I.W. Dairymen's Association. He leaves a widow.

The funeral service will take place at the Methodist Church on Monday afternoon. Cremation following at Southampton.
