FORMER BOWLS CHAMPION'S DEATH

Mr. **Edwin Philip TOPP**, aged 62. of 96 High-street, Ryde, a former England bowls champion, died at a local nursing home on Wednesday. A native of Binstead, he had lived in the Island all his life, and for the last 33 years had been in business in Ryde as a confectioner and newsagent. For several years he was organist at the Primitive Methodist Church, High-street, and when the Methodists united he became organist at the Garfield-road Church, continuing until ill-health occasioned his retirement.

In the sphere of bowls he won an unrivalled reputation for an Island player. From 1920 for more than 10 years, he was acknowledged the finest bowler in the country. His outstanding year year of 1931, when he became the only Island player ever to have won the English Bowling Association singles title. In a memorable final he beat his opponent by 21 shots to 8. The next year he was selected for the England trials match, but illness robbed him of his chance of playing for his country, and the probability of a successful internation career, as in the opinion of many experienced judges he was one of the most brilliant bowlers the game has known. The truer the green the more clearly was his skill demonstrated. He first represented the Island in 1923, and he continued as a county player until 1950, with one break of three years. In Ryde he did much for the game. Apart from the playing skill which gained him many championship awards, he served the local club as hon, secretary, and

many present-day bowlers benefited from his tuition. A few years before the war he was responsible for starting the indoor bowling-rink at Edward-street, Ryde, where novices were introduced to the game during the winter. Mr. TOPP was formerly an enthusiastic member of Ryde Harriers.

He leaves a wife. His only son lost his life in 1941, when a Portsmouth-Ryde steamer was sunk by enemy action. The funeral will take place at the Ryde Methodist Church on Monday at 2 o'clock.
