DEATH OF MR J. W. TRODD

We regret to record the death from heart failure, following an operation at the County Hospital, of Mr J. W. TRODD an ex-schoolmaster and one of the oldest and best known members of the teaching profession in the Ryde district. He was many years under the Borough Education Committee in charge of Bettesworth Road Schools from which he retired on superannuation since which he has been living in retirement and about a year ago built a bungalow in Ashley parish where he resided with his wife up to his death. The news that he had passed away on Sunday came quite as a shock to his friends as he was about until quite recently and despite his advancing years - he was 68 - was of very active habits. He was one of the old members of the local Volunteers and did

honourable service during the war being drafted to a Labour Corps at Swindon where he obtained a commission and retired with the rank of captain. He belonged to the British Legion and always displayed deep interest in the welfare of the ex-service men and their families. It was primarily in their interests that he filled a casual vacancy on the Town Council but did not seek re-election. The late Mr TRODD maintained his keen interest in educational matters and was a candidate for the S. E. Division of the Borough at the triennial County Council election in 1922 in opposition to Alderman A. ANDREWS (the Mayor) but was defeated. Formerly he was on the Committee of the Hants Football Association and also took great interest in the doings of the Ryde Sports Club. Much sympathy is expressed with the widow and grown up family. One of his sons holds an official appointment under the Leyton (Essex) Urban District Council and another who was formerly in the I.W. Constabulary and reputed to be the tallest man in the force some months ago went out to Hong Kong where he holds an appointment. The late insurrection to China caused his father much anxiety. The funeral takes place today (Thursday).
