It is with very much regret that we announce the death of Mr. Alfred Peter TRUSCOTT, of "Kinsha," Victoria Street, who passed away on Tuesday afternoon after a long illness at the age of 50. Mr. TRUSCOTT was a member of the British Legion and the Conservative Clubs where many friends will regret his passing. He joined the Royal Navy as a boy, and during the late war he served in the Blacksod Point signalling station off the North of Ireland. After the cessation of hostilities he was transferred to the coastguard station at Bembridge where he took the rank of Petty Officer. In 1922, when the Coastguard service was reduced Mr. TRUSCOTT moved to the Customs and Excise department at Ryde and held an appointment there until a year ago when ill health forced him to relinquish his duties.

Mr. TRUSCOTT took a great interest in young people and gave signalling instruction to the Girl Guides at Bembridge and Ryde, and also taught a number of them to swim. Much sympathy will be felt with the widow and the two children.

The funeral will take place tomorrow (Friday) at All Saints' Church at 2.30 pm.

After Alfred's death, his wife Emma Ann Truscott, was shown to be residing at 21 Victoria-street, Ryde, on the 1947 Register of Electors.
