DEATH AND FUNERAL OF CAPTAIN TWYNAM.

We regret to record the decease of Capt. TWYNAM, of Woodvale, Cowes, which took place at Ryde on Monday morning last. he had been in failing health for some months and after a visit to Bournemouth for change of air went to Ryde. the end came rather unexpectedly, and Mrs. TWYNAM and her daughters, who were on the Continent, were unable to return to England before the Captain's death. Captain TWYNAM was well known in Cowes and was a past Ruling Councillor of the Stanhope Habitation of the Primrose League. The deceased gentleman was well known in yachting and other sporting circles in the Island. He was a director of the I.W. Railway Company, had been a member of the Royal Victoria Yacht Club for more than a decade, and was a frequent competitor at the I.W. Gun Club.

The funeral took place at Ryde Cemetery yesterday afternoon. The first part of the service was said at All Saints' Church, the Rev. O. T. BULKELEY officiating.
