DEATH OF AN OLD INHABITANT.---We regret to record the death of Mr. Richard URRY. Every one knew "Dick" (as he was commonly called) for, having driven coaches and carriages all his life, he came into contact with many people in the Island, especially visitors, amongst whom his somewhat dry humour and fund of anecdote made him popular.

For 50 years he had been employed at the well-known mews at the bottom of George-street, and there is no doubt he continued at his employment long after the time when, in the natural course of things, it would have been better for him to have retired. Last winter, while waiting in a pouring rain for a gentleman he had driven to an evening party, and who seems to have forgotten all about his coachman, the poor old man caught a severe cold, and had to go into the Royal Isle of Wight Infirmary and County Hospital, where careful nursing and skilful treatment soon brought him round. He was then taken to the Convalescent Home, but having led an active life he tired of the restraint, and left, with the result that he had a relapse and died on Tuesday.

Many visitors and residents will miss the old man's cheerful face and hearty manner.
