The Late Mr. D. A. VALVONA.- The funeral took place on Saturday of Mr. Dominic Anthony VALVONA, aged 57, of 11 High-street, Oakfield. Mr. VALVONA, who passed away after only a week's illness, was well known throughout the Island as a marine store dealer. He came of an Italian family that had resided at Oakfield for the last 43 years, and was known and liked by everyone in the district. He leaves a widow, five sons, two serving in the Forces, and four daughters.
