#### **DEATH OF MISS WADE**

The death took place at 2, Monkton-street, on Sunday, of Miss Florence Julia, WADE, second daughter of the late Rev. Arthur John WADE, first vicar of Holy Trinity Church (1845-1893). Miss WADE, who had been in failing health for 10 years, was 75 years of age. For many years prior to her indisposition she was a very busy and energetic worker in the parish of Holy Trinity.

The funeral took place on Tuesday, the first part of the service being held at Holy Trinity Church, where the Vicar (the Rev. N. H. STUBBS) officiated. The men's choir chanted the 23rd Psalm and led the singing of the hymns "Jesu, Lover of my soul" and "Abide with me." As the remains were carried from the church the Nunc Dimittis was chanted and the organist (Mr. A. Percy JAMES) played "O rest in the Lord." The chief mourners were Dr. A. and Mrs. WADE and Mr. H. F. and Mrs. WADE (brothers and sisters-in-law), Mrs. PHILLIPS (sister), Miss WADE and Miss V. WADE (nieces), and Mr. and Mrs. E. SEARLE. Among others present were Dr. J. D. DAVIES, Mr.

G. FARDELL, Mr. A. J. LOCKE, Mrs. STUBBS, the Misses READY, the Misses FIRTH, the Misses WEBB, Miss PILKINGTON, Miss L. CAREY, Miss LINDESAY, Miss STENNING, Miss HUTCHINGS, Mrs. Hugh MEARES and Miss MEARES. The interment was at the cemetery and a number of floral tributes were placed on the grave.
