**The Late Miss E. WALLIS.**---The Rev. E. E. M. GREEN officiated at the funeral at Ryde Cemetery on Saturday of Miss Emily WALLIS, of 77 Park-road. The mourners were Mr. H. W. BULSTRODE (nephew) and Mr. and Mrs. O. WALLIS (cousins). Miss B. WALLIS (niece), with whom Miss WALLIS had lived, was unable to attend through illness.

Miss WALLIS, who was 85, died at Newport on Wednesday week. She was the last surviving child of Ald. W. H. WALLIS, a well known Island auctioneer and at one time deputy mayor. She excelled at wood carving and was also a talented painter and needlewoman. For 50 years she was organist for the Y.W.C.A. at Garfield House, and for 40 years pianist at week-day meetings at St. James's Church Hall. She also showed much ability as a composer of music. When 18 she received a medal for bravery in rescuing a youth from drowning.

Messrs. LANGDON were the undertakers.
