DEATH OF MR. A.E. WARMAN

An inquest is to be held to-day (Thursday) at 11.30 on the death of **Mr. Alwyn Edward WARMAN**, of "Merrowdown House," Upton-road, Ryde who passed away suddenly on Sunday at the age of 43.

Mr. WARMAN, a native of Binstead, had suffered from ill-health for several months, and was subject to fainting attacks. A week before his death he sustained a minor accident when he fell from the open doorway of a car.
