MILITARY FUNERAL

The funeral took place, with military honours, on Thursday afternoon, at the Cemetery, of Trooper **John Pain WINSTANLEY**, 5th Cavalry Reserve, a former resident. He was in India, when war broke out, and at once rejoined (having previously been in the 7th Hussars). On reaching England he was transferred to the Cavalry Reserve. About a week since he was sent from Tidworth to the County Hospital suffering from severe throat trouble, and death took place on Tuesday. Deceased who was 49 years of age, leaves a widow and only child.

The coffin was covered with the Union Jack, and the Worcestershire Regiment provided the firing party and escort. The Rev. J. E. Eddis, M.A., R.D., officiated. The mourners were the widow, daughter, and brother (Dr. WINSTANLEY).
