LADY RESIDENT'S DEATH

We regret to announce the death which occurred somewhat suddenly on Tuesday 27th, of Miss Caroline WOODCOCK, of Lochiel-villas, West-street, where she had resided for the past 29 years with her sister, Miss Helen WOODCOCK. The two sisters were practically never separated and the surviving sister naturally feels her loss very keenly. Their father Mr. Richard WOODCOCK, who died in Jersey in 1870, was formerly connected with a well-known firm of bankers in Coventry, hus wife who subsequently died at Southampton, being interred in the same grave as her husband.
