DEATH OF COLONEL WOODWARD.

Ryde has lost a well-known resident in the person of Lieutenant- Colonel **Basil H. WOODWARD**, late of the Gordon Highlanders, who died at Dover Lodge, Ryde, on Saturday last. He entered the Army in 1869, and in 1884 served with the Egyptian Expedition in the Sudan, taking part in the Battles of El Teb and Tamai, and receiving the medal with clasp and the bronze star. He also took part in the Nile Expedition of 1884-5 for which he had a clasp. He retired from the Gordon Highlanders in 1892. He was once mentioned in despatches.

The funeral was held at St. John's Church, Ryde, on Wednesday. The chief mourners were the widow of the deceased gentleman and Major PAINE, late Gordon Highlanders and Captain E. W. BURT, R.N. The coffin was draped with the Union Jack and bore the following inscription: "Basil Hall WOODWARD, Lieut. Colonel, late Gordon Highlanders, aged 63 years, died 10th January, 1914."
