## WILL OF THE LATE CAPT. JELLICOE.

Captain John Henry JELLICOE deputy-chairman of the Southampton and I.W. Steam Packet Co., Ltd., a director of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Co., and formerly Commodore of the latter Company's Fleet, who died on 7th September, aged 89 years, father of Sir John Rushworth JELLICOE, K.C.V.O., C.B., now in supreme command of the Grand Fleet, left estate of the gross value of £52, 192 2s., of which net personalty has been sworn at £52, 034 4s. 11d. Probate of his will has been granted to Mr. C. E. KEELE, solicitor, and Mr. F. J. BURNETT, stockbroker, and power is reserved to grant probate also to his son Admiral Sir John Rushworth JELLICOE. The testator left £50 to each executor of his will, and to his wife Mrs. Lucy Henrietta JELLICOE, he left £400, his wines, and consumable stores absolutely. He also left £100 to the County Hospital, £10 to his old and faithful servant, Miss Ann SLIGHT, "with affectionate regard," and the residue of his property upon trust for his wife for life. On her decease he left various presentation silver to his children, including in his bequests to his son Admiral Sir John Rushworth JELLICOE the silver salver presented to him by passengers of the Tamar, and a small silver salver which came to him from the CLARK HILL family. he left the balance of his household effects to his daughters, and the residue of his property as to sixsevenths between his daughters, Edith Lucy JELLICOE and Grace Lizon JELLICOE, and one seventh between his sons, the Rev. Frederick Gilbert Gardiner JELLICOE and Admiral Sir John Rushworth JELLICOE.
