PATH MEASUREMENT

Measuring the width of various paths in the Cemetery and considering the relation to their use in the past and the present together with other considerations not immediately obvious. Suggested paths are detailed on the Map on the following page. A 20 metre tape-measure is most suitable for this task and one can be made available

PATH A - This Path is of interest because the present width can be measured and then the width of the path in the 1800s can be measured. The path has been narrowed by later graves being provided either side of the original path. This can be seen easily at certain points where the dates can be read from the older graves,



PATH B - This path can be measured and it can be shown that the path could not have had graves dug as there is a sewer beneath the path. Manhole covers can be seen.

PATH C - This is the Main Carriageway and is the only path in the Cemetery that has a tarmac surface. This is because it is the path along which hearses carrying coffins move.

PATH D - This path is known as 'Millionaire's Row' as the graves to the east are mainly Vaults. This is where wealthy people were buried and there would have been a large number of people at the internment. The entrance to the vaults cannot be seen but can be pointed out and explained.
