Bowler's Death .- The funeral took place on Monday of Mr. Charles Willoughby ADAMS, aged 83, of 7 Bellevue Road, a former captain of the Bowling Club. Mr. ADAMS, who died at St. Mary's Hospital, Newport, on Christmas Eve, came to the Island from Hastings, and as a young man was in business at Sandown. Later he and his wife were proprietors of Dorset House, Dover Street. He worked for Messrs. FARDELLS for many years, retiring in July. His skill on the bowling green had its reward in 1946, when he won the singles championship at the Ryde open tournament. He was a member of the Town Club and at one time was hon. secretary of Sandown Conservative Club. His wife died in 1950 and he leaves two sons.

The funeral service took place at All Saints' Parish Church, Ryde, on Monday, conducted by the Rev. G. W. RUMBLE (assistant curate). Members of the Bowling Club, the Town Club and representatives of Messrs. FARDELLS attended. Burial was at Great Bookham, Surrey, Parish Church, on Tuesday in the grave of his wife. The service was conducted by the rector (Canon A. M. HUGHES) and the mourners were Mr. and Mrs. B. C. ADAMS (son and daughter-in-law), Mrs. M. FEIST and Mrs. R. HALSEY (sisters-in-law) and Mrs. H. R.
