MR. G. BARTLETT Lived in America for fifty years

A native of Ryde, Mr. **George BARTLETT**, died on December 16 at Los Angeles, California, at the age of 89. Mr. BARTLETT served for four years as a Bandsman on a British mano-war, *H.M.S. Pylader*, from which he was paid off on September 2, 1871.

The following month he married Miss WILKINS at St. Thomas's Church, the ceremony being carried out by the Rev. Alexander POOLE, then Vicar of Ryde.

Twelve years later they left Ryde for America, intending to go to Winnipeg, Canada, but they remained in the United States. After a year at Dulath they spent two years at Helena, Montana, and then went to Tacoma, Washington. In 1895 they went to California, first living at San Diego, and from 1897 in Los Angeles.

Mr. BARTLETT's father was Captain Harry BARTLETT, who was employed for over 30 years by the Southampton and I.W. Steam Packet Company. A brother, Mr. Frank BARTLETT, who died about eighteen months ago, was a pioneer of road transport in the Island and Portsmouth, and another brother, Mr. John BARTLETT, followed his father's career, going to sea and being shipwrecked three times.
