DOCTORS' TRAGIC DEATH.

We regret to record the death of Dr. Thomas INGLIS, F.R.C.P., of "Westover," High Park-road, which occurred under very sad and tragic circumstances on Saturday morning whilst visiting Mr and Mrs MORANT, of 6, Lind-street. The former was suffering from an injured thigh and his wife an injury to her knee. Mrs HANSON of the Conservative Club adjoining, had been looking after them and whilst the doctor was seated by their bedside she left to get some hot water. Directly afterwards she heard Mrs MORANT call out and on hurrying back observed that Dr. INGLIS had dropped back in his chair apparently dead. She called Mr HANSON, the steward of the club who sent for medical assistance and called in P.C. LAVERY who happened to be passing at the time. The doctor died in the constables arms and was beyond all human aid. The distressful event naturally created the utmost concern and was a great shock to Mr and Mrs MORANT, the doctor being an old friend of theirs.

The deceased gentleman who was 72 years of age led a very quiet life and suffered from heart trouble which was of long standing, and Dr. BROOME who had attended him strongly warned him of the danger of ascending hills or of even walking upstairs. The facts were communicated to the District Coroner and as Dr. BROOME gave the necessary certificate he decided it was unnecessary to hold an inquest. Though not so well-known as some of the other medical practitioners in the town he was held in much respect by a numerous circle of friends who will miss him greatly and much sympathy is extended to his wife in her great bereavement. She is sister-in-law of the late Dr. LOWE who also died suddenly whilst attending the Empire Day demonstration at the school some years ago.
