## **OBITUARY - MR. W. G. BARRETT**

The death occurred rather suddenly at his home, 42 Weeks-Road, Ryde, on Saturday morning, at the age of 73, of Mr. William George BARRETT, an old and respected resident. Mr. BARRETT joined the Royal Navy in 1889, seeing his first service afloat in sail. Among more than twenty ships in which he served were H.M. Ships Garnet, Hood, Good Hope, Duke of Wellington, and before retiring in 1912, H.M.S. Espigle, in the Persian Gulf. He was awarded the Persian Gulf Clasp, 1909-14. Rejoining the Navy in 1914, Mr. BARRETT served in H.M. Ships Excellent, Ganges and Victory. After the war, as a volunteer, he was caretaker of a German floating dock at Harwich until 1920, when he returned to civilian life and his pre-war work on Messrs. CHAPLIN'S cargo boats. Subsequently he served in private yachts, and was later employed at the Royal Victoria Yacht Club.

Mr. BARRETT leaves a widow, three sons, who have all served in the Royal Navy, and a daughter,

with whom much sympathy is felt.

The Rev, H. BRAMWELL HOWARD officiated at the funeral at the Ryde Cemetery on Tuesday . The mourners were Messrs. F.W.C., L.G., and W.H. BARRETT (sons), Mr. H.R. JAMES (half brother), Mr. R.J. ROBERTS (son-in-law), and Mr. R. GALLOP (brother-in-law). There was a number of beautiful floral tributes.
