DEATH OF MR. H.WHITTINGTON

We regret to announce the somewhat sudden death of Mr. Henry WHITTINGTON, of 33 High-street. It seems that on Wednesday morning deceased got up and was lighting the fire when he threw up a quantity of blood. He went to bed and remained there till Thursday night, declining to send for a doctor. Between 6 and 7 o'clock on that day he got out of bed and was found lying dead in his room in a pool of blood. Dr. TURNER was called in and attributed death to a rupture of a blood vessel or an aneurism into some part of the air passages. The circumstances were reported to the Deputy Coroner, who decided that an inquest was unnecessary. Deceased was an ardent supporter of the Football and Harriers' Clubs and other sporting organisations. He was 58 years of age.
