He could always find Shakesperian quotations suitable for any circumstances, or declaim, as long as he had a sympathetic listener, passages from his favourite bard. Mr LAKE took a great interest in Oddfellowship, and was one of the first to join the East Medina Lodge, of which he had been the G.M., and many of the older generation of Ryders will learn with regret that one so well known and intimately associated with the Ryde of 30 years ago has passed to his rest.
