OBITUARY
MR. G. NICHOLSON

We regret to record the death at a Ryde nursing home on Thursday of Mr. **George NICHOLSON**, the well-known and respected chemist and resident of Ryde for more than thirty years. He was in his 62nd year. A native of Westmoreland, Mr. NICHOLSON studied at the Liverpool School of Pharmacy, and qualified in 1904, becoming a member of the Pharmaceutical Society.

In October 1906, he came to Ryde as assistant chemist to the late Mr. T. FLOWER at the present business premises. In 1912 Mr. NICHOLSON took over the business, which became widely known under his management. He took a prominent part in Island Pharmaceutical and photographic spheres, and was the immediate past president of the I.W. branch of the Pharmaceutical Society, and a founder

member and for many years hon. secretary of the I.W. branch of the Photographic Dealers' Association. He was also chairman of the I.W. Pharmaceutical War Committee.

Mr. NICHOLSON was a foundation member of the Ryde Rotary Club, and had ever been an enthusiastic and valued Rotarian. He had a deep love of the countryside, was a splendid shot and a keen fisherman. A true sportsman, he was held in the highest esteem and respect. Sincere sympathy is felt with the bereaved family.

The coffin was taken into Ryde Parish Church on Friday evening and on Saturday morning Canon R.S. MOXON (Vicar) officiated at the funeral service. The Rev. C. HEALD (rector of Binstead and Rotary Club chaplain) read the lesson.
