

Death of Mrs. A.F. MORRIS. – The death occurred in a local nursing home on Friday week of Mrs. Annetta Florence MORRIS, aged 77 of 93 George Street, widow of Mr. E.F. MORRIS, a master baker and confectioner, who died in 1941. A native of London, she came here 50 years ago and was a prominent member of the Congregational Church and a past member of the Townswomen's Guild and Haylands Women's Institute.

The funeral service took place at the Congregational Church on Monday. The Rev. G.J. NELSON officiated assisted by the REV. L.A.D. WOODLAND (son-in-law and chaplain of King's College Hospital), who recited the Greek Contakion in memory of her father, Mr. Christo YANNEDIS, a Greek. Mrs. K. INGRAM (organist) accompanied the singing of "Hark, hark my soul". The mourners were Mesdames H.B. STEELE, I. EDWARDS, and L.A.D. WOODLAND (daughters), Mr. H.B. STEELE (son-in-law), and Mrs. A. CHANNON (sister). Dr. I. EDWARDS (son-in-law) was prevented from attending. The Congregational Church was represented by Mr. W.J. TAYLOR (elder), and Mrs. E. HOSKING (deacon), Mrs. W. ATTRILL (representing Mr. W. ATTRILL, deacon), and Mrs. W. PINCHARD (ladies working party). Among others present were Messrs H. JARVIS and P.H. ROLF (Messrs. John ROBINSON and JARVIS, solicitors).

The interment was at Ryde Cemetery. The wreaths included one from the Congregational Church.
