DEATH OF MR. F. NUTBROWN.---The death occurred somewhat suddenly on Monday, whilst on holiday at Lincoln, of Mr. Frank NUTBROWN, of St. Wilfred's, Haylands. He had been an invalid for two years and was 59 years of age. For 34 years he had been chauffeur to Major H. Du BUISSON. He was a member of the British Legion. During the war he served with the British Ambulance Committee and was awarded the Croix de Guerre. He also served in the Boar War with the 6th Inniskilling Dragoons. He was a trustee and former secretary of the local United Methodist Church. His only son predeceased him two years ago.

The funeral took place at the United Methodist Church on Thursday, when the Rev. W. H. MILDON, B.A., officiated. The hymns were "Fight the good fight" and "Jesus, the very thought of thee." Mr. R. BLAKE played "O rest in the Lord." The mourners were the widow, Mr. and Mrs. J. ELLIOTT (brother-in-law and sister), Mr. J. DAWKINS (brother-in-law), Mrs. J. T. DAWKINS (sister-in-law). The Rev. R. TROLLEY conducted the service at the cemetery.
