### **Obituary - MR. F. S. WHITTINGTON**

A keen gardener who had won many prizes and medals at Island horticultural shows, particularly for carnations, in which he specialised, died at St. Mary's Hospital on Monday, following a fall at his home a few hours earlier. He was Mr. Fred Scott WHITTINGTON, aged 60, of 30 Simeon Street, Ryde, who had been a semi-invalid for five years.

The eldest son of Mr. C. WHITTINGTON of Downend, Arreton, where he was born, he was later apprenticed to Messrs. HAIR & Sons, builders, as a bricklayer. During the 1914-1918 war he served with the I.W. Rifles and was engaged on demolition work at Cowes and Portsmouth during the last war. He was later employed by Messrs. E. W. TROUGHTON, Binstead, until his illness. A former secretary of Haylands, Swanmore, and Asheys Horticultural Society, he was also a member of the R.A.O.B. he leaves a widow, five sons, three daughters and fifteen grandchildren, the last of which, a boy, was born to his son, P.C. Norman WHITTINGTON only three days before his death.
