**FUNERAL OF THE LATE MR. C. DIMMICK,
OF RYDE.**

Mr. C. DIMMICK, a member of an old and respect Ryde family died on Monday, and the funeral took place at the Ryde Cemetery yesterday afternoon, the Rev. Charles VOYSEY, of the Theistic Church, officiating. The mourners were Messrs. Wilfrid DIMMICK and Frederick DIMMICK (sons), John and James DIMMICK (brothers), Alfred and A.E. DIMMICK (nephews), Mr. GRAHAM (representing the public control department of the London County Council), and Mr. W.F. SHAW, inspector of the same department. Amongst others present were Messrs. W. JACOBS, F.N. BRODERICK, H. LONG, and W. HOPGOOD.

In the course of the service the Rev. C. VOYSEY passed a eulogium on the deceased for his intensely conscientious and honourable character, saying he could not be negligent, careless, or indolent in any duty he had to perform. He was generous and willing to make excuses for others. His friends loved him because he had such a wealth of love in his own breast; because he loved God with all his heart and rejoiced in his glorious goodness. The coffin bore the inscription "Charles DIMMICK, died March 25th, 1900, aged 48 years."
