A YOUNG TEACHER'S DEATH. - Sincere and very general sympathy has been aroused in the town and neighbourhood by the pathetically premature death of **Miss A.F.L. HAYDEN**, youngest daughter of Capt. G.C. and Mrs. HAYDEN. The deceased young lady, who was very widely known and won the affection of all with whom she was brought into association, had only just commenced duty as a governess at the Hanover House school, under the Misses SHAW. Probably as a result of a chill, peritonitis supervened and an operation was successfully performed by Messrs. DAVIES, RICH, and WADHAM, but unfortunately, the poor girl was unable to rally and death followed on Wednesday, the 7th inst.

The funeral took place at the Cemetery on Saturday, the Rev. H.B. BREW conducting a most impressive service, which was attended by many of deceased's friends. The Vicar of Holy Trinity Church (the Rev. W.M. CAMERON) was prevented from attending by indisposition. There was a large number of very beautiful wreaths, testifying to the grief, sympathy, and love of an extensive circle of friends, including one from Mrs. GAUSSEN, of Twyford, near Winchester, and others from the Misses SHAW and the Mistresses of Hanover House school, and the scholars of that establishment.
