HAVENSTREET. SUDDEN DEATH OF MRS. MEREDITH

We regret to record the death of Mrs. Jane MEREDITH, widow of Mr. John MEREDITH, which occurred suddenly on Monday evening at Guildford Farm. Mrs. MEREDITH, who was 77, had just returned from walking in the garden when her daughter discovered that she had collapsed in the house. Dr. CHURCHILL was quickly summoned from Ryde but could only pronounce life extinct. A post mortem was held, and death was found to have been due to heart failure. The acting deputy coroner dispensed with an inquest.

Before coming to Guildford Farm five years ago Mrs. MEREDITH had resided since 1920 at HALLETT'S Dairy, High-street, Ryde, of which she was the proprietress. She originally came to the Island from Clapham. She was a member of Garfield-road Methodist Church and was widely respected. Sincere sympathy is felt with the family in their sad and sudden bereavement.

The funeral took place yesterday (Friday) afternoon at Garfield-road Methodist Church. The Rev. A. TRIGGS officiated. The family mourners were Mr. A. MEREDITH (son), Mr. and Mrs. B. MEREDITH (son and daughter-in-law), Mrs. C. BEDDING (daughter), Mr. F. MUNDY (son-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. T. DAVIDSON, and Mr. and Mrs. F. BRACE (sons-in-law and daughters), Mrs. H. MEREDITH (daughter-in-law), Miss Mollie BEDDING (grand-daughter), Mr. R. EDWARDS (nephew), Mrs. BRACE; sen., Miss E. DAVIES (nieces), Mrs. AYLETT (great niece), Mr. A.C. WOODESON and Mr. BADGER (the farm foreman). The staff of HALLET'S Dairy and the farm also attended.

The interment was at Ryde Cemetery and choice flowers were placed on the grave
