DEATH OF MR E. H. PETERS

We have to record the death on Friday last, of Mr E.H. PETERS, M.D., at his residence, Westwood, Queen's Road. The deceased gentleman, who had attained the age of 84, was (jointly with the late Mrs PETERS, his wife) the owner of considerable landed estate in this town, and had resided here for any years. He was a member of the connection known as the Plymouth Brethren, by whom he was held in high esteem. Mr and Mrs PETERS were the founders, and supporters for many years, of schools in Albert Street, which, owing to the extension of the School Board system, were however, given up by Mr. PETERS on the death of his wife. He still maintained a Mission Hall in West Place, West Street, and amongst the members of the connection to which he belonged was very helpful and charitable.

The respect in which he was held amongst them was shown by the large number who attended the funeral, which took place on Wednesday morning, at the Cemetery, Ryde. The principal mourners was Mr Samuel PETERS (brother), Mr Ernest PETERS and Mr. John PETERS (nephew), Mrs Ernest PETERS and Misses PETERS (nieces), Mrs BANNISTER, Miss G ROWAN, Mr and Mrs P. W. DOLTON, Dr. Arthur REID, Mr Arthur THOMPSON, Mr Robey F. ELDRIDGE, J.P., and Mr Jas. ELDRIDGE. There also attended Mr W.E. RADCLIFFE, Mr G.R. BRIGSTOCKE, Mr Claude E SMITH, Major WYNDHAM, Mr James NEWMAN, Mr Albert MIDLANE, Mr James STAMP and others. Mr HUNTER, of Southsea, conducted the service.
