**HENRY WALLIS**, deceased. – Pursuant to an Act of Parliament made and passed in the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, “An Act to further Amend the Law of Property and to relieve Trustees,” Notice is hereby given, that all person claiming **DEBTS** or **LIABILITIES** affecting the Estate of **HENRY WALLIS**, late of Ryde, in the Isle of Wight, Estate and House Agent, deceased (who died on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1869), and to whose Estate administration was, on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1869, granted by the Principal Registry of Her Majesty’s Court of Probate to **HELEN WALLIS**, of Ivy Cottage, Spencer-road, Ryde aforesaid, are to send to the said Helen WALLIS their Claims against the Estate of the said intestate on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> day of April, 1870, at the expiration of which time the said administratrix will distribute the Estate of the said intestate among the parties entitled thereto, having regard only to such Debts, Claims, and Demands of which she shall then have had notice; and the said administratrix will not be liable to any person of whose Claim she shall not have received notice at the time of distribution.
